PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

- 8) Grant weather that nourishes all of creation: God of mer-cy, hold us in love.
- 9) Keep watch on our loved ones and keep us from danger: God of mer-cy, hold us in love.
- 10) For all the beloved who rest in your mercy: God of mer-cy, hold us in love.
- 11) Help us comfort us all of our days: Keep us, hold us, Gra-cious God.

One: Great and merciful God, Source and Ground of all goodness and life, give to your people the peace that passes all understanding and the will to live your Gospel of mercy and justice, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
